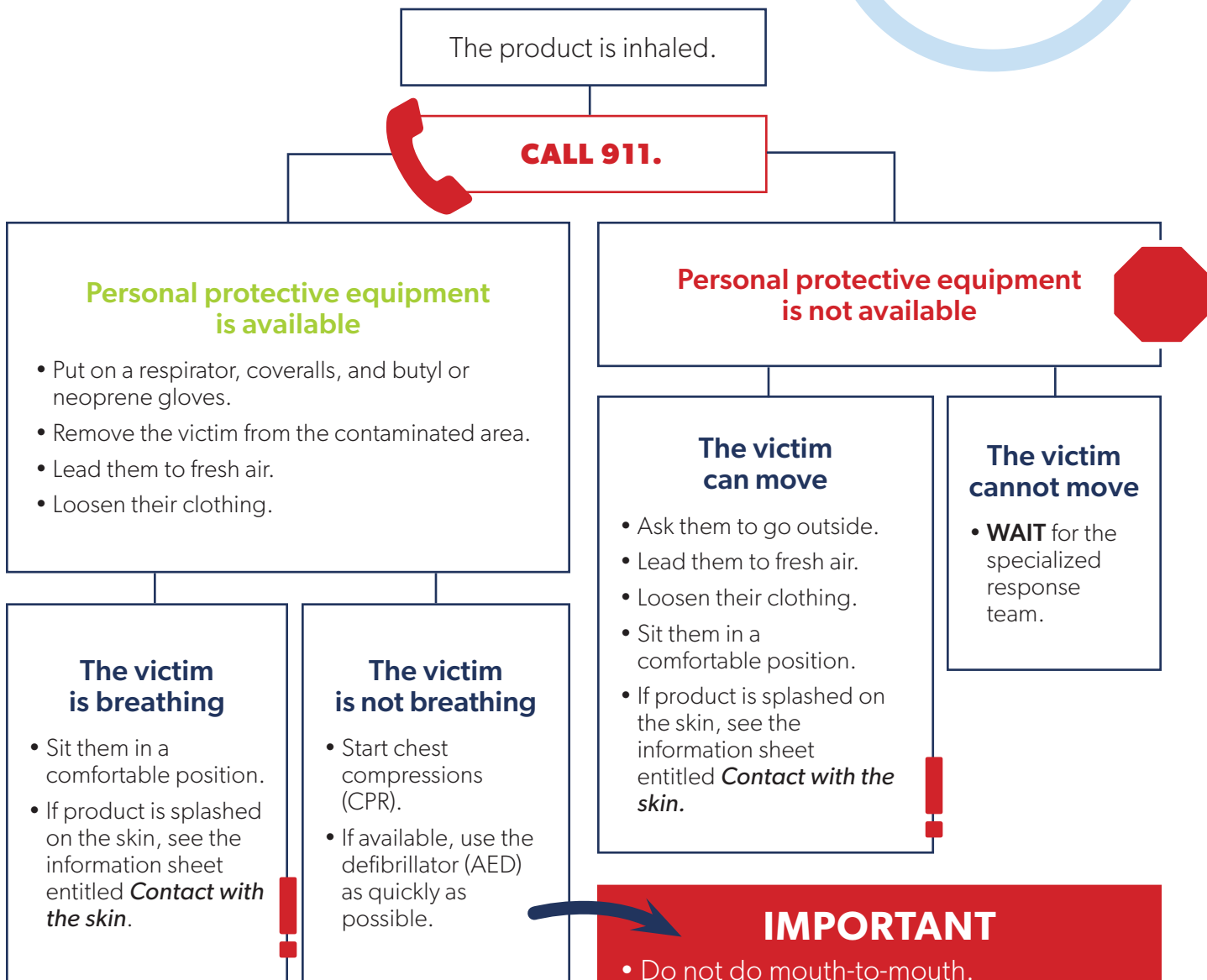


FIRST AID

Hydrofluoric acid | inhalation



IMPORTANT

- Do not do mouth-to-mouth.
- Do not use a pocket mask.

IMPORTANT

Make sure the victim leaves with the product's material safety data sheet.



IMPORTANT

The first responder must wash their hands thoroughly after removing their gloves.

FIRST AID

Hydrofluoric acid | ingestion




The product is ingested.

Put on butyl or neoprene gloves before touching the victim.

The victim is breathing

- They must rinse their mouth out with water and spit.
- Sit them in a comfortable position.
- If product is splashed on the skin, see the information sheet entitled *Contact with the skin*.

The victim is not breathing



CALL 911.



- Remove the victim from the contaminated area, if applicable.
- Start chest compressions.
- If available, use the defibrillator (AED) as quickly as possible.

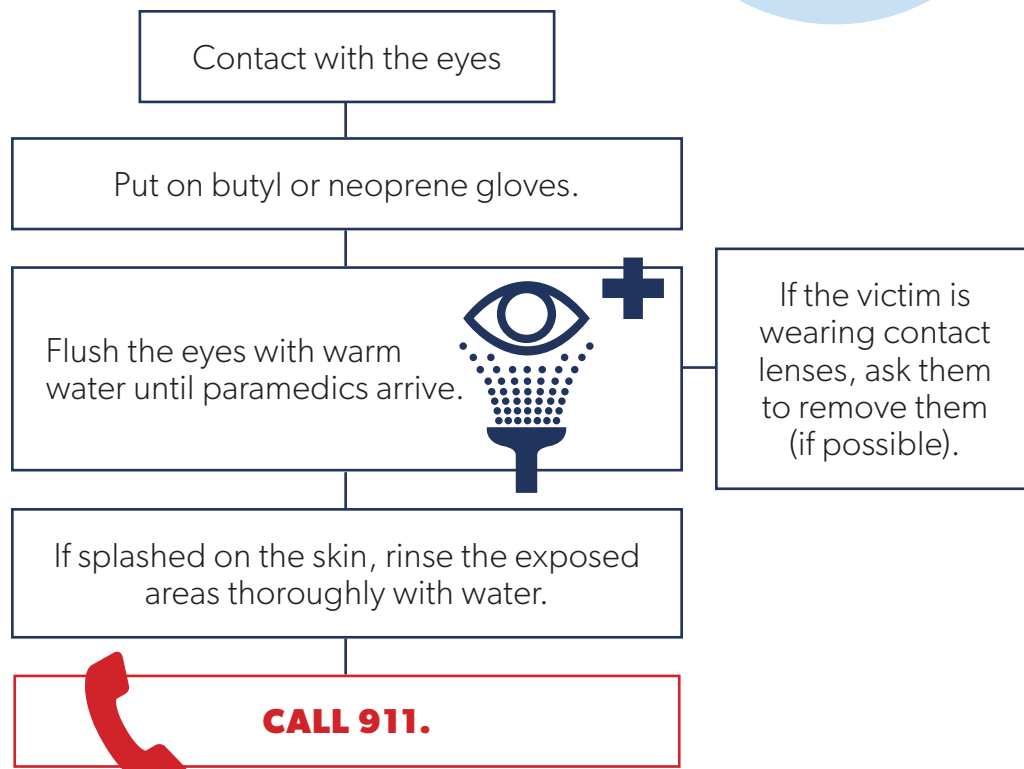

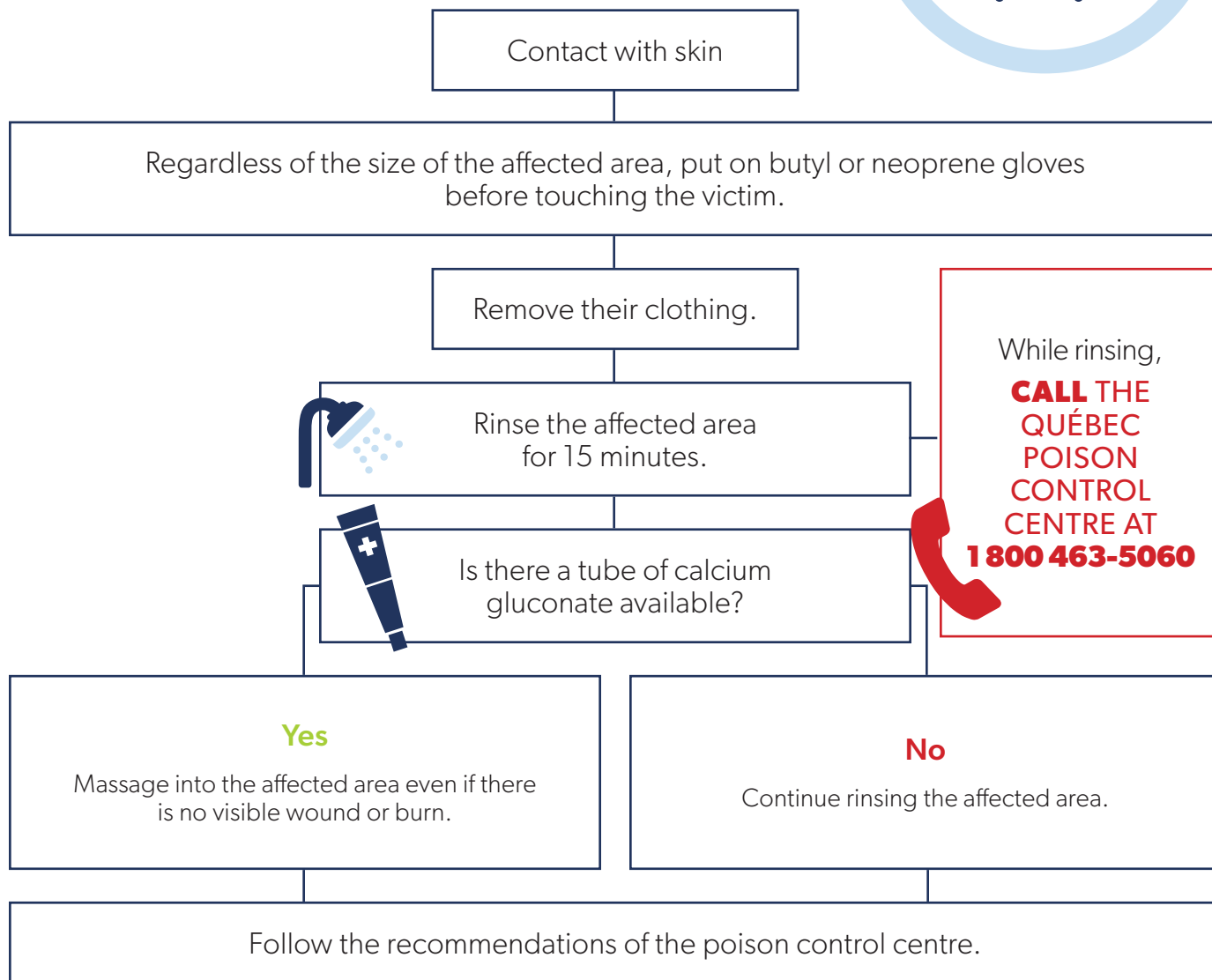
