Personal protective equipment is available

The victim is breathing

- Sit them in a comfortable position.
- If product is splashed on the skin, see the information sheet entitled *Contact with the skin*.

The victim is not breathing

- Start chest compressions (CPR).
- If available, use the defibrillator (AED) as quickly as possible.

Personal protective equipment is not available



The victim can move

- Ask them to go outside.
- Lead them to fresh air.
- Loosen their clothing.
- Sit them in a comfortable position.
- If product is splashed on the skin, see the information sheet entitled *Contact with the skin*.

The victim cannot move

• WAIT for the specialized response team.
